# **Running Start College–Level Placement Options**

College-level English OR math placement is required to participate in the Running Start program at North Seattle College. Please check northseattle.edu/testing for information on how to take North's placement tests during campus remote operations due to Covid-19.

North Seattle College's English Self-Directed Placement (DSP)	Self-reflection of student's abilities to determine English class placement. <u>Access the DSP here</u> .	English& 101 Placement
ALEKS Math Placement Test (Math score valid 1 year)	Standardized test taken at Seattle Central College for placement into specific math courses. <u>Link to ALEKS</u> <u>instructions.</u>	Placement into any college-level math class 100-level and above.
Smarter Balanced (SBAC)	Standardized test taken at the high school in 11 <sup>th</sup> grade. <i>Note: this test</i> hasn't been offered by the State during COVID.	ELA - English Language Assessment: Level 3 or higher Math Assessment: Level 3 or higher w/ applicable grades on high school transcript
SAT English placement Limited math placement (English score valid 2 years, Math score valid 12 months)	Standardized exam taken at high school or other location.	English& 101 Placement: Combined Reading/Writing score 510 or higher Math: Minimum score 520 (Math& 107 only option based on SAT score)
ACT English or math placement (English score valid 2 years, Math score valid 12 months)	Standardized exam taken at high school or other location.	English& 101 Placement: Reading score 19 or above AND English score 19 or above Math: Minimum score 22
Unofficial Transcript from a college or university	Student was awarded credit at a college or university for college-level English (within past 2 years) or math (within past 12 months).	Provide copy of unofficial transcript to determine English and/or math placement.
Seattle Public Schools High School Transcript *Math Placement Only	A student who has taken specific math courses at a Seattle Public School may be qualified to use their transcript to place into college-level math.	Provide copy of Seattle Public Schools unofficial transcript to determine math placement. Placement varies based on course and grade ( <u>details here</u> )
AP (Advanced Placement) or IB (International Baccalaureate) Exam Scores	A student who has taken AP/IB exams in specific subjects.	Provide a copy of AP/IB exam scores. Scores must be evaluated by Running Start office.

## How to Take the Test(s)

- Apply to North Seattle College and receive a student ID number
- Email the Testing Center at <u>nsctesting@seattlecolleges.edu</u>: include your full name, student ID number and request to take the English and/or math placement test
- Within 2 business days, you will receive directions on how to access and complete the placement tests
- Placement tests cost \$35 (for both English and math). You must pay in order access your test results. You can pay at <a href="https://mynorth.seattlecolleges.edu/">https://mynorth.seattlecolleges.edu/</a> log in with your student ID number and PIN, click "MyNorth" and then click "Pay Tuition". If you're eligible for free/reduced lunch at high school, please email <a href="https://mscorstart@seattlecolleges.edu">mscorstart@seattlecolleges.edu</a> to request a waiver for the testing fee.

#### **English Self-Directed Placement**

- Untimed, takes a student approx. 15 minutes
- This is not a test. This is a tool to help students determine their ability in English and guides the student on determining which class-level will be most for the student.

#### Math Placement Test

- Standardized test taken at Seattle Central College for placement into specific math courses.
- Link to ALEKS instructions
- 2 hour time limit for each attempt
- You are allowed one retake
