


* **Medic One Foundation Partnering with NSC on EMT Scholarships** – <u>Medic One</u> <u>Foundation</u> is partnering with North to offer 10 full training scholarships to future emergency medical technicians (EMT). There is a high demand for EMTs in King County and surrounding communities, and North's training program is the most prolific in the region. The training class begins in spring quarter, and the <u>application deadline</u> for scholarships is March 7. <u>Learn more</u>.

* **Discover Seattle Colleges Events Coming to North in March** – Mark your calendars and save the dates for the 2024 Discover Seattle Colleges series. For several years now, Discover Seattle Colleges events have provided prospective students with firsthand information and guidance on opportunities at the three district colleges, including North Seattle College. This year, there are three facets to Discover: online events, open houses and field trips. North's open house is scheduled from 3:30 to 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, March 14, in the Grove. * ECE Developing Pilot Math Course with Boeing and Childcare Aware – Last September, NSC's Early Childhood Education (ECE) team completed phase one of the Math Equity Project in partnership with Childcare Aware Washington and Boeing, and has been invited to participate in phase two, which launched last month. This project aims to develop a MATH 133 course, Math for Early Childhood Educators. The goal is to pilot the course at NSC and pending success, convert the course into a statewide common course.

* Grant Application for Pharmacy Tech Apprenticeship Program Approved – The Career Launch Enrollment FTE Students redistribution 23-24 grant application for NSC's Pharmacy Technician Apprenticeship program has been approved in the amount of \$120,000 per year for at least three years, with the possibility of sustained funding if NSC reaches FTE goals for the Pharmacy Tech program. In addition to general outreach and support of the program, the funding will be used to support development of a groundbreaking partnership with Sno-Isle Tech Skills Center, in which the Pharmacy Tech apprenticeship coursework is being taught in collaboration with the Health Care Apprenticeship Consortium to high school students through College in the High School (CHS). NSC is the first in the state to offer a workforce apprenticeship through CHS. NSC is creating a brand-new model for apprenticeship education, and it is only a matter of time before other institutions in the state take note.

* ECE Program in Seventh Year of Partnership with Bainum Family Foundation – NSC's ECE program completed a sixth year of partnership with the Bainum Family Foundation and recently entered a seventh year in January. The primary goal of the partnership is to fund scholarships and community building events, as well as supporting the work of language immersion cohorts. The Bainum Family Foundation works alongside



communities experiencing racial and economic disparities to create lasting systems change for the well-being of children and families.

* **Puget Sound LSAMP Receives Social Justice Award** – On Jan. 12, the Social Justice Award was presented to the Puget Sound Louis Stokes Alliances for Minority Participation (LSAMP), at Seattle Colleges' 51st Annual Community celebration of Martin Luther King Jr. LSAMP is funded by the National Science Foundation and its purpose is to strengthen the preparation, representation, and success of historically underrepresented students in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) majors.

* **Quotidian Queer Now Showing at NSC Art Gallery** – The NSC Art Gallery is currently showing Quotidian Queer featuring the work of 17 queer artists. The show, curated by Jessica Marie Mercy, continues through March 1. Gallery hours are Monday through Thursday, 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Friday 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Learn more.
