* **North Staff Present at NASPA Conference** – North Housing Resource Specialist Shannon Thomas and Dean of Student Support Services Jeanette Miller presented on student housing insecurity with University of Washington-Tacoma and the Washington Student Achievement Council at the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA) conference March 12. Shannon and Jeanette served on a panel examining the different ways we support our students in housing crisis.

* ECE Staff, Faculty Present at League for Innovation Conference – North faculty member Ninder Gill and staff members Annie Garrett and Anna Saradeth presented at the League For Innovation conference March 17-20. Their session was titled, "Nearly a Decade of Off-the-Chart Completion: One Program's Story." The session covered how North launched the state's first Bachelor of Applied Science in Early Childhood Education (ECE) in 2016. The program has experienced a retention and completion rate of approximately 90% throughout its existence and has grown from 25 students in Year 1 to more than 200 students today. Annie Garrett, BAS alum and My Brother's Teacher mentor Matt McKenzie, and Meka Riggins and Carol Jack of Childcare Aware presented another session titled, "Collaboration Counts: A Public-Private Math Equity Project." In 2023, North collaborated with Childcare Aware of Washington to support its work on a math equity grant funded by Boeing. They shared the design process where they collaborated across multiple sectors and fields, centering student voice as they developed a contextualized, trauma-informed math curriculum.

* **Persist! Movement and Protest Art Continues through April 26** – Persist! Movement and Protest Art continues through Friday, April 26, in the NSC Art Gallery on the courtyard level of the Instruction Building. The show pulls together posters, art, zines and ephemera from a wide variety of movements, while focusing on pieces that educate, inspire and fuel resistance. Gallery hours are Monday through Thursday from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Friday from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

* **BAS Technology Programs Receive Funding to Assist Student Placement** – North's Application Development and Computer Science programs worked with Riipen, Inc. on a proposal for funds granted through Computing for All as part of the Washington Jobs Initiative. The proposal was awarded \$300,000 to assist in placement in short-term, technical projects, with a stipend, for 125 students and graduates. The proposal will not only provide additional experience for participants, but \$1,000 and a chance to prove themselves in organizations looking to expand their hiring pool.

* Separate Fire Drills Planned for College Center, Instruction Building – Two fire drills are currently scheduled for 9 a.m. on Tuesday, April 16, and 2 p.m. on Thursday, April 18. The April 16 (9 a.m.) drill will be specifically for the College Center building, while the April 18 (2 p.m.) drill will be confined to the Instruction building. Since these do not affect the entire campus, the RAVE emergency alert system will not be used. All students, faculty, staff and visitors in the affected buildings are asked to please follow evacuation procedures during the drills.

* **Spring Quarter Parking Permits Available** – Employees can purchase quarterly parking permits online from the parking portal or sign up for an annual parking permit via payroll deduction (if eligible). Quarterly and annual permits are virtually linked to vehicle license plates; there is no hangtag permit to display.
