

Seattle Colleges Chancellor Dr. Rosie Rimando-Chareunsap made the announcement in mid-June.

* New Intergenerational Mural Unveiled – A new multigenerational mural celebrating the diverse generations of students who have attended the college's cooperative preschools and parent education program was unveiled on June 12. The mural, located on the north end of campus, was pioneered by the Visibility Community Council (VisCoCo) at NSC. The mural showcases the collaborative efforts of current children from various co-ops, alums and artist René Julio, an alum parent of the Pollitos Cooperative Preescolar en Español. René Julio was chosen to lead this project due to his exceptional artistic talent and connection to the cooperative preschool community.

- * Get Ready for 10th Annual CE Student Art Exhibition Calling all art lovers! The hottest art event of the summer is coming to North's Art Gallery July 16 to Aug. 15. The 10th Annual Continuing Education Student Art Exhibition will kick off Monday, July 15, with an opening reception from 6 to 8 p.m. This event will also feature an awards ceremony beginning at 7 p.m. Don't miss out on this artistic extravaganza!
- * First Year Experience and Orientation to College Success Earlier this year, North added a new full-time position focused on building the first-year student experience. This new role homes in on New Student Orientation and supports the long-term goal of making HDC 101 Orientation to College Success, NSC's First Year Experience course, mandatory for most students as a degree requirement. HDC 101, housed within the Counseling department, added sections and expanded to five new part-time faculty members teaching winter and spring quarters. During spring quarter, the Allied Health AAS-T became the first NSC degree approved by the Curriculum and Academic Standards Committee to require HDC 101 as a mandatory course.
- * Lifelong Learning Nominations Accepted through Aug. 30 The Seattle Colleges Board of Trustees is accepting nominations for the 2024 Lifelong Learning Awards, designed to recognize the outstanding employees in our college community. Nominations must be made by employees of Seattle Colleges (self-nominations are not accepted) and nominees must have a minimum of five years' experience in Seattle colleges. Past award recipients are not eligible; however, past nominees who were not awarded may be resubmitted.
