Advisor

During your advising appointment, your advisor will...

- Provide a safe and respectful space to ask questions, discuss interests, and express concerns.
- Be a responsive listener, provide encouragement, and collaborate with you to generate solutions to challenges.
- Guide decision-making to help you create an education plan that fulfills your goals and career pathway.
- Recommend appropriate classes and help you navigate ctcLink and other tools/resources to assist you in course selection and registration.
- Provide resources relevant to your individual needs.

Student

When meeting with your advisor....

- Take initiative to set up meetings with an advisor to complete an education plan and for other questions regarding academic planning and success.
- Plan to meet with your advisor before next quarter registration opens (schedule an appointment during week 3 of the quarter!).
- Arriving on time will ensure your advisor will be able to meet with you for your full appointment
- Actively engage with your advisor by asking questions and sharing your interests and goals.

To move toward academic success...

- Check your email account regularly, manage your inbox and respond to actionable items.
- Take ownership of your academic success by utilizing the tools provided throughout this guide.
- Follow through on advising recommendations in a timely manner.

ADVISING APPOINTMENT

A 30 minute appointment is ideal for new students registering, updating an existing education plan, and for students who want to talk about transfer/program options.



Available Mondays-Fridays, in-person and on Zoom, depending on your assigned advisor's availability. Same-day appointments may be available, but it is best to schedule in advance.

DROP-IN ADVISING

Drop-In Advising is best for quick questions and assistance that can be completed in 10-15 minutes. Available on a first-come, first-served basis both on-campus and virtually over Zoom.

NEED A PERMISSION NUMBER?

Submitting your request online through the Advising Contact form is the best way to request a permission number!

APPOINTMENT TIPS



An education plan is a quarter by quarter plan of classes you will take based on your goals, program of study, transfer plans, and personal schedule. You will want to review and update your education plan with your advisor, as needed.

BEFORE

- Review the "How We Work Together" on page 3 of this guide
- Prepare and write down a list of questions to discuss
- Bring all necessary paperwork and placement documents
- Review your education plan
- Cancel or reschedule in Starfish, if needed

DURING

- Arrive on time
- Check-in at the front desk, log onto the Zoom link, or call your advisor depending on your appointment modality
- Share why you came in to see your advisor and ask the questions you prepared
- Establish a relationship with your advisor
- Share your interests and goals
- Be sure to take notes!

AFTER

- Review the notes you took during your appointment and notes your advisor made in Starfish
- Follow through on next steps and recommendations provided by your advisor
- Email your advisor with follow up questions
- You are always welcome to make another appointment!

Things to Include When Contacting Us



Include your full name, ctLink ID number, program or degree you are interested in, and how an Advisor can help you. If leaving a voicemail, please speak slowly and clearly. Please allow 48 hours for a response excluding holidays, weekends and peak times for advising.

Quarterly Advising Cycle



Summer quarter is only 8 weeks long and has different deadlines than fall, winter and spring quarter due to the accelerated schedule. Summer quarter dates/deadlines are indicated in bold below.

ctcLink helps students manage their entire college experience -- from adding/dropping classes, viewing your academic progress, paying for classes, and more.

[Starfish](#)

This tool helps you schedule an appointment with your primary advisor, access your education plan, view Advising Notes from meetings, and connect with current instructors and campus resources. *Use your MySeattleColleges credentials to log in.*

[CANVAS](#)

The virtual extension of your classroom where your instructor may post updates, assignments, materials and other information relevant to that class. *Use your ctcLink credentials to log in.*

[Office365 Student Email and Apps](#)

Currently enrolled students can access their student email as well as other cloud-based products like Word or Excel from anywhere. *Use your MySeattleColleges credentials to log in.*

Official Credit Evaluation

You need an official credit evaluation if you want to have credits from another college or university (or AP/IB test scores) applied toward degree or certificate requirements at North Seattle College. Once you've submitted an official transcript to North, you should submit an evaluation request. Credit evaluations take a minimum of 12 weeks, so plan early and start this process during your first quarter at North.

Graduation Application

You can apply to graduate directly through ctcLink during your final quarter. If you have questions about your graduation eligibility, meet with your advisor or faculty coordinator. Students can expect to see their degree/certificate awarded on their transcript within 5 weeks and to receive their mailed diploma within 8 to 12 weeks. Congratulations!

Academic Student Progress

Applies to all students: Students are expected to pass and complete their coursework and maintain a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher. Should your GPA fall below a 2.0, you will receive an academic progress notice. Your advisor can help you understand this policy.

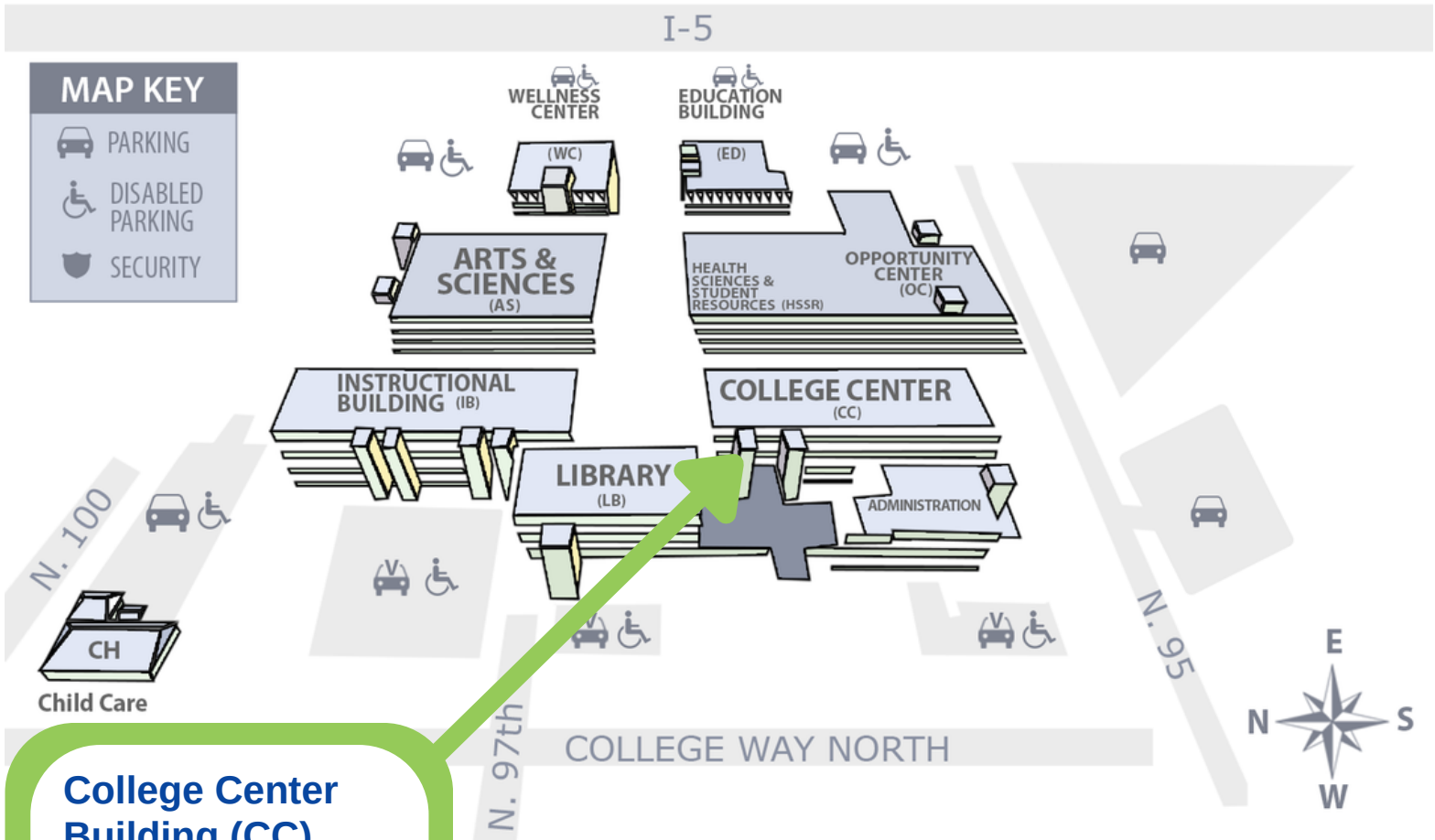
Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

Applies to students receiving Financial Aid: All students receiving Financial Aid are required to maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) to continue receiving this funding source. This is separate from Academic Student Progress. It is recommended to meet with the Financial Aid Office to better understand this policy.
