\* National Hispanic Heritage Month – From Sept. 15 to Oct. 15, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month, a time to celebrate the heritage, history, traditions and cultural diversity of Hispanic Americans whose heritage is rooted in Spain and 19 countries and territories: Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Puerto Rico, Uruguay and Venezuela. This heritage month is celebrated to highlight the independence of several countries. Sept. 15 is the day that five Latin American countries celebrate their independence from Spain: Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala,



Honduras and Nicaragua. Mexico celebrates its independence on Sept. 16 and Chile on Sept. 18. Also, Indigenous Peoples Day or Dia de la Raza, in mid-October, falls within this 30-day period. This year's theme is "Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together." <u>Learn more</u>.

\* **New Online Bookstore** – Beginning fall quarter, Seattle Colleges will transition course material and textbook services to Akademos by VitalSource. This is a new online bookstore

model where students order textbooks and course materials through a website and then have physical items delivered by mail while digital access information is emailed. This new platform offers affordable textbooks and other course materials, convenience and choice. It makes the textbook ordering process easier, presenting materials all on one webpage. Textbooks will no longer be sold on North's campus, so please keep that in mind for upcoming academic terms. The new online bookstore website is expected to be available to faculty and administrators soon, before students are notified, so outstanding course material adoptions can be added. - \* North Partners with Northeastern to Support Student Pathways in Tech North has partnered with Northeastern University to support building pathways for graduates in the technology sector. The collaboration is designed to support underrepresented populations in breaking into the tech sector, providing robust pathways for students and graduates to advance their careers with Northeastern's programs. Through this partnership, North students and graduates will benefit from qualifying for a 5% scholarship, breaking into tech with programs made for students without tech backgrounds, receiving personalized support throughout their education journeys, attending industry and networking events at the Northeastern Seattle campus before enrolling, and applying to Northeastern with a waived application fee. - \* North Participating in WSAC Postsecondary Benefits Promotion Pilot North will be participating in the Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC) 2024-2025 Postsecondary Benefits Promotion Pilot. The pilot is an outreach campaign that will encourage income-eligible students (as determined by the FAFSA/WASFA) to apply for public benefits. Recent research highlights significant basic needs insecurity among postsecondary students, with one in three Washington students experiencing food insecurity. Less than half of these students access public benefits and campus resources that could support them. The pilot aims to identify students likely eligible for public benefits but not currently receiving them and to test targeted outreach strategies to connect these students with necessary resources and support. WSAC will provide technical support and facilitate cross-college engagement on effective outreach practices.
- \* Transit & Tunes Celebration on NSC Campus Sept. 6 – King County Metro and Sound Transit are hosting "Transit & Tunes: New School Year Celebration" in the north parking lot of campus from 2 to 7 p.m. this Friday, Sept. 6. The event is free



and will feature several activities, including live jazz by Michael Powers, food trucks, beverages, desserts, backpack giveaways, a John Lewis Pedestrian Bridge walk, chalk art contest, face painting and a bouncy house. There will be a live radio broadcast and ORCA card giveaways, as well. The whole family is invited to enjoy the fun and learn about commute rider options.

- \* North to Receive Grant to Support First Generation Resource Fair Nov. 6 North was informed recently that it is receiving a \$1,000 grant in support of its First Generation Resource Fair, scheduled Nov. 6. The grant comes from FirstGenForward and The Council for Opportunity in Education, with funding provided by the Strada Education Foundation and TIAA. The resource fair on Nov. 6 will feature on-campus support and services available for First Generation students at North.
- \* Seattle Medium Features NSF Grant to Bolster LSAMP Program The renewal of a three-year, \$1.5 million grant from the National Science Foundation to bolster the Louis Stokes Alliances for Minority Participation (LSAMP) program at North was recently featured in the Seattle Medium. LSAMP Director Tina Akinyi and North President Dr. Rachel Solemsaas were quoted in the article, focusing on the critical role the LSAMP program and the new funding play in ensuring the success for students of color in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) fields. - \* James Baldwin Mural Makes News Gaycities.com, an LGBTQ travel website and mobile app, recently listed North's James Baldwin mural as one of "4 stunning murals of James Baldwin you have to see right now." North's mural was included with murals in New York City, Phoenix and San



Francisco, and the website noted the unveiling of the mural in the library building's third floor. Mural Art Course Instructor Kelda Martensen is quoted in the piece, which also highlights the mural's depiction of Baldwin's passport photo, the Istanbul landscape, a portrait of him at his Istanbul apartment, the Eiffel Tower and Harlem brownstones. - \* Save Bus20 Group Seeks Support Despite multiple appeals, it appears that King County Metro is planning to proceed with the Bus20 route termination on Sept. 14. The Save Bus20 Group is not giving up, however, and is collecting personal stories of why Metro's alternative bus routes to Bus20 are not workable. The group is also creating a contact list for sharing future information and actions. In addition, King County Metro is conducting two informational webinars on Wednesday, Sept. 4, from 6 to 7 p.m., and Thursday, Sept. 12, from noon to 1 p.m.
- \* Light Rail Link to Lynnwood Now Open Four new light rail stations opened Aug. 30, serving north King and South Snohomish counties. The new stations include Shoreline South/148th, Shoreline North/185th, Mountlake Terrace and Lynnwood City Center. The extended light rail reach now provides additional commute options for employees and students who live in north of campus.
