Pharmacy Technician Certificate (Winter Start) Area of Study: Health and Medical

Credits



This pathway meets the requirements for the Pharmacy Technician certificate. This sample schedule assumes a winter start. Students starting in the winter complete the same curriculum as fall start students, however, the certificate is completed over four consecutive quarters at a more moderate pace of 12-16 credits a quarter. Fall start students complete the certificate over three consecutive quarters and are enrolled in 18-19 credits a quarter. If you wish to take alternative courses not listed below, please meet with your program coordinator to confirm you're still meeting certificate requirements.

 Quarter 4 (Fall) □ Update competencies, cover letter, and resume in your portfolio □ Download the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB) app on your phone to complete practice questions.
☐ Add classmates on LinkedIn to grow your network and stay in touch☐ Take the PTCB national exam as early as 30 days prior to graduation
or after completing the program.
☐ Order cap and gown for commencement, which will take place at the end of Spring quarter.
Attend on-campus graduation fair and commencement ceremony, which will take place at the end of Spring quarter.
