- * NSC Federal Title III Grant Closes on High Note The North Seattle College Title III grant from the Department of Education concluded on Sept. 30, after six transformative years. The grant provided one-time funding with the goal of institutionalizing key initiatives by the end of its term. NSC successfully closed equity gaps in student retention and completion; built a new computer lab and the Equity and Welcome Center; launched over 60 100-Day faculty and student projects; identified and scaled up the First Year Experience course (HDC 101-Introduction to College Success); eliminated high stakes testing and implemented no cost, Directed Self-Placement for math and English; updated the assigned advising model and developed program maps for pathways; introduced data dashboards and co-requisite math courses, and created open education resource question banks in the pre-calculus math pathway and new student orientation.
- * Unity Forest Installed at North NSC partnered with National Urban Forest to create a unity forest, which was planted on the south end of North's campus Oct. 19. NSC grounds hold more than 11 acres of wetlands that are home to a variety of animal species, and the addition of this forest



with native species creates a distinct, self-sustaining ecosystem and provides habitat for species like the Pacific Tree Frog, further enriching the biodiversity on campus. With this forest, the site will offer a space of relaxation and reflection for the North community. <u>Learn more</u>.

* NSC Recognized for Inclusive Excellence and 'Raising the Bar' – North is one of nine colleges in Washington state eligible to apply for a new U.S. Department of Education (DOE) award program recognizing inclusive excellence. The DOE used publicly available data to measure performance on key indicators related to equitable access, success and post-college outcomes for students of color and low-income students at public and nonprofit institutions across the country. The colleges now have a chance to participate in the next phase of the selection process for the department's Postsecondary Success Recognition program. The program is part of the Biden administration's Raise the Bar initiative, which aims to increase postsecondary completion rates, close completion rates and ensure all students earn valuable credentials. The initiative seeks to honor higher education institutions based on how well they prepare graduates for the workforce and fulfilling lives, rather than exclusivity.

- * North Student Food Pantry Giving Campaign As originally communicated to all staff via email Oct. 14, North is launching a student food pantry to help our students who are experiencing food insecurity. Funds collected will be spent on food for our students. North has also received a grant from student leadership, but those funds can only supplement the food pantry's needs, and not be a primary source of support. - * Golden Star Employee of the Quarter Nominations Open Nominations are still open for the Fall 2024 Golden Star Employee of the Quarter. - * City Grants \$50K for North as Part of Decarbonization Work The City of Seattle's Office of Sustainability & Environment announced Oct. 23 that North is receiving one of eight grants as part of the city's decarbonization efforts. The grants are designed to help building owners install decarbonization retrofits, such as replacing fossil fuel gas furnaces with electric heat pumps or conduct engineering and technical analyses head of future Building Emissions

Performance Standard (BEPS) target deadlines. North's grant is in the amount of \$50,000, which will be used for an engineering analysis of the campus heating system. <u>Learn more</u>.
