ASSOCIATE OF FINE ARTS DEGREE



North Seattle College's Art Program provides a solid foundation in studio art, coupled with an emphasis on a range of techniques and materials not generally offered in community colleges. The wide array of affordable courses includes ceramics, drawing, computer art, 2-D and 3-D design, metal design, printmaking, painting, jewelry-making, and sculpture — as well as art history. The <u>North Seattle College Art Gallery</u> showcases celebrated artists of regional and international renown. The exhibition schedule, visiting artist lecture series and crossdisciplinary programming bring contemporary art and critical

thought from a diversity of artists right to your classroom. The gallery attracts visitors from the campus and larger community and offers work-study positions for real-world training in art handling and exhibition design. Art instructors are successful working artists, respected in their fields and serving as both role models and mentors. NSC art studios are well-equipped and updated.

Enrollment in North's art program requires no prior experience in art. All classes are transferable and fulfill general education requirements for an <u>Associate of Arts degree</u> or a specialized <u>Associate of Fine Arts (AFA) degree</u>.

Candidates for the Associate of Fine Arts degree must complete a minimum of 90 college level credits (numbered 100 and above) with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher. Students must submit a digital portfolio with documentation of 15-20 pieces made during their time at North. Portfolios are completed during ART 290 - Art Business.

Steps to an Associate of Fine Arts Degree or Certificate in Fine Arts:

- 1. Make an appointment with the Arts, Design & Graphics Area of Study Academic Advisor, Jillian Fisher jillian.fisher@seattlecolleges.edu to create an Education Plan. If you are a Seattle Promise, Running Start or International Student, meet with your assigned advisor or retention specialist.
- 2. If you have transferred here from another school and you wish to have credits from other colleges apply, refer to <u>https://northseattle.edu/credentials</u>. Request that your official transcript(s) be sent to the Credentials office. Keep in mind this process can take up to 12 weeks to complete.
- 3. When you register for your final classes, <u>apply for graduation</u> through ctcLink.
