

<u>Certificate in Fine Art</u> Program Planning Guide

Program Description: The Certificate in Fine Art (CFA) certifies completion of approved work and is suitable for students currently working in art; while credits may transfer to a university, it is not a specific transfer certificate. The CFA serves as a halfway point and pathway toward the Associate of Fine Art (AFA) degree. Students with a bachelor's degree may choose the CFA for additional art certification.
