\* **March is National Nutrition Month** – National Nutrition Month is a nutrition and information campaign sponsored annually by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. The <u>campaign</u> is designed to focus attention on the importance of making informed food choices and developing sound eating and physical activity habits. \* North Represented at State Advocacy Day – On Jan. 30, Seattle Colleges Chancellor Dr. Rosie Rimando-Chareunsap, South Seattle College President Dr. Monica Brown, and Seattle Central College Interim President Dr. Chantae Recasner visited Olympia for state advocacy day. Jill Lane, acting director, Access, Community, and Opportunity, and tenured Political Science faculty, substituted for North Seattle College President Dr. Rachel Solemsaas, and joined them at the state legislature. The leaders met with a half dozen state legislators, advocating for the needs of Seattle Colleges. Students were also in Olympia that day, as were



delegations from other State Board of Community and Technical Colleges (SBCTC) around Washington. Special kudos to **Samantha Baneth** from North's student leadership who helped organize the Seattle delegation at North and testified Feb. 3 at the request of Rep. Gerry Pollet (D-46th District) about legislation that would allow for a student representative on SBCTC's Boards of Trustees. Other students attending included **Sumnima Rai**, **Quince Bisard** and **Roger Tang**. Seattle Colleges remains committed to serving as open-access learning institutions that prepare each student for success in life and work, fostering a diverse, engaged, and dynamic community.

\* North Staff Meet with State Legislators on Postsecondary Basic Needs – Jeanette Miller, dean, Student Leadership; Shannon Thomas, specialist, Workforce Education; and Laura Lubash, advisor, Workforce Education, visited Olympia Feb. 5, to speak with legislators about the great need for postsecondary basic needs. They met with State Sen. Hansen's staff and State Rep. Macri from Seattle. The North team emphasized the importance of housing, food and mental health assistance, and that while the state has made great progress in supporting college students in these areas, there is still much work to do. The Postsecondary Basic Needs Coalition sponsored the lobby day.

\* Art Faculty Member Featured in Magazine – Paul Komada, part-time faculty member in North's Art Department, is featured in the current issue of Public Display Art magazine. In the piece, which can be found on page 34, Paul shares how his work "emerges from a meditative and deliberate process, centered on the slow and meticulous craft of hand-knitting.

Learn more. \* **Tree Frogs are Calling** – It's that time of year when the Pacific Tree Frog population on North's campus becomes very active and the chorus of calls can be heard in the evenings. North holds a very large breeding population of the amphibians, which of course also serve as our college mascot. On evenings when the temperatures are right, male tree frogs move to the water and call out to the females to signal the start of breeding season. The females head to the chorus and attach their eggs in masses to blades of grass and sticks under the water. Typically, the tadpoles hatch in March and develop through the spring. Last year, the tree frogs became famous as they were featured on <u>KING-TV's Evening Magazine</u>.
