Important Notes & Requirements
To earn this degree, students must:

- Complete at least 90 college-level credits (courses numbered 100 or above), including credits transferred in, with a minimum cumulative college level GPA of 2.0
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in courses at the degree awarding college.
- Earn at least 15 credits at the degree granting college.
- Have a minimum passing grade of 1.0 in all courses.

Other Notes:

- Courses may only be used once in Basic, Distribution & Elective requirements.
- Sequences should be completed at the same institution.
- Students should apply for degree/graduation one quarter prior to anticipated graduation date, and after registering for that graduating quarter.
- Completion of degree does not guarantee admission to a university/major program nor that all university/major admission and general education requirements are met.
- Check with the college where you plan to transfer to ensure you meet all admission requirements, including but not limited to foreign language, English, lab science, math and social science.
- Note that Statistics courses do not fulfill UW math admission requirements (CADRs, College Academic Distribution Requirements).

Students who took PHIL &106 or PHIL&120 before Fall 2013 must take MATH 098 (min. 2.0 GPA) or higher.
