## ENGINEERING AS-T TRACK 2/MRP DEGREE Important Notes & Requirements

#### To earn this degree, students must:

- Complete at least 98 college-level credits (courses numbered 100 or above), including credits transferred in, with a minimum cumulative college-level GPA of 2.0
- Have a minimum cumulative college-level GPA of 2.0 in courses at the degree-granting college
- Earn at least 15 credits at the degree-granting college
- Have a minimum passing grade of 1.0 in all courses
- Apply to graduate (northseattle.edu/graduation)

#### Other Notes:

- Courses may only be counted toward one requirement.
- Sequences should be completed at the same institution.
- Completion of degree does not guarantee admission to a university/major program nor that all university/major admission and general education requirements are met.
