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# **DEGREE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS**

VISUAL, LITERARY, AND PERFORMING ARTS (VLPA) (Humanities and Arts) 15 Credits

Choices must include a minimum of two different course prefixes.

No more than 5 credits of a world language at the 100 level may be used in this category.

No more than 5 credits of a studio/performance class (\*asterisked on approved list) may be used in this category. Maximum 10 credits per prefix.

INDIVIDUALS, CULTURES, AND SOCIETIES (ICS) (Social Sciences) 15 Credits

Choices must include a minimum of two different course prefixes.

Maximum 10 credits per prefix.

NATURAL WORLD (NW) (Natural and Physical Sciences, Mathematics) 15 Credits Choices must include a minimum of two different prefixes; 5 credits must be in a lab science (\*asterisked on approved list). \*\*Students may choose up to 5 credits from the following: Anthropology, Computer Science, Engineering, Geography, Mathematics, Philosophy, Psychology. Maximum 10 credits per prefix.

\*\*Up to 5 credits total allowed from the following group:

Anthropology: ANTH &204, &205, 275 Computer Science: CSC 110, 111, 142, 143 Engineering: ENGR 110, &204 &214, &215, &224, &225, 240 Math: All MATH college transfer courses number 102 and above. Technical math courses NOT usable for transfer purposes. Philosophy: PHIL &120 Psychology: PSYC 222

ELECTIVES
30 Credits

15-30 credits of academic or college transfer courses numbered 100 or above, specifically:

- Additional courses that would otherwise count toward Basic or Distribution requirements, i.e. additional Math, VLPA, ICS, or NW courses
- Academic Electives at North: ACCT &201, &202, &203 BUS &101, &201, 210 ENGL &235
- Physical Education Activity Courses (PEC) (3 cr. max)
- Transfer courses in Seminar, Directed Readings, Special Projects/Topics (E.G. 198, 296, 298, 299)

0 – 15 credits "Restricted" electives: Any college-level courses numbered 100 or above not listed in the Basic or Distribution Requirements.

HDC 101 Required (2 cr. – some students may qualify for an exemption)

<u>SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:</u> Within the 90 credits required for the AA degree, students must complete special requirements. If a course fulfills more than one special requirement, it is listed in parentheses next to the course (ex. **CMST** 205 fulfills Communications and US Cultures).
