- * Construction Updates Here is an update on current campus construction projects:
 - Library During construction, a leak was discovered in the main water supply line. Contractors put a sleeve over the leak as a quick remedy. We decided to have the main water supply line replaced for the longevity of the building to prevent any future leaks or other costly issues. Construction continues to focus on HVAC in the west side tower and working on roofing as weather allows. Electrical switch gear has arrived, and a new power feed has been supplied to the building. Valley Electric is working on getting power restored to the building. Long lead-times continue to be an issue as the project moves along. We are discovering that substantial completion for the second and third floors will be June 25. The first and second floor will be completed by late August. Although we have two different dates, we're still on track to open the library for Fall Quarter 2023.
 - <u>Classroom Renovations</u> Bids have been reviewed and a contract was awarded.
 We are currently working with the contractor to build a schedule to start this
 project with minimal impact to our students, faculty and staff. We are also
 working with Open Square to replace the furniture in these renovated rooms to
 meet ADA standards.
 - Water Reclamation This system in now back up and running. We have
 discovered some minor bugs to work out in the software that monitors the
 system. We are currently working with the vendor to iron out these issues.
 Metering devices were installed to monitor the amount of rainwater is used vs city
 water. This Water Reclamation System save several hundred gallons of water
 during our heavy rainfall winters, while also able to use city water during hotter
 summer months.
 - Facilities Update Elevator 7 continues to be under repair. A previous roof leak caused some rusting and damage to some of the electrical switches and one circuit board. Kone has been working with their supplier to get the required parts. We are expecting to have this elevator back up by this Friday, April 7.
