Important Notes & Requirements**

**To earn this degree, students must:**

- Complete at least 90 college-level credits (courses numbered 100 or above), including credits transferred in, with a minimum cumulative college level GPA of 2.0
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in courses at the degree awarding college
- Earn at least 15 credits at the degree granting college
- Have a minimum passing grade of 1.0 in all courses

**Other Notes:**

- Courses may only be used once in Basic, Distribution & Elective requirements.
- Sequences should be completed at the same institution.
- Students should apply for degree/graduation one quarter prior to anticipated graduation date, and after registering for that graduating quarter.
- Completion of degree does not guarantee admission to a university/major program nor that all university/major admission and general education requirements are met.
