Suggested Schedule to Associate of Arts-Direct Transfer Agreement with an emphasis in Art History

This pathway meets requirements for the Associate of Arts Direct-Transfer Agreement (AA-DTA) degree with an emphasis in Art History. This sample schedule assumes a fall start. If you wish to take alternate courses please meet with a North advisor.

To Do

Schedule an appointment with your Arts, Design & Graphics advisor in Starfish to meet and discuss your goals. Drop by the Library to get help with research; check out resources; access computers and study space; and create media projects. Visit the Student Learning Center to learn about tutoring services offered inperson and online.
Explore the Campus Art Community through Art Group, Art at North Listserv, and the Art Gallery. Check out campus life: student clubs, Equity & Welcome Center, Wellness Center, TRIO, Benefits Hub, etc.
Create an Educational Plan with your assigned advisor. Apply for financial aid for the upcoming academic year in Winter or Spring quarte to maximize your funding options.
Check Licton Springs Review and League for Innovation deadlines. Continue to document all work made in class every quarter. Explore careers and majors: workshops, counseling and career services. Visit North's Transfer webpage for transfer information. Inter 3 Update your educational plan with your assigned advisor. Consider Student Leadership positions and other on-campus jobs. Apply for the Seattle Colleges Foundation Scholarship and other scholarships. Talk with your assigned advisor about summer electives. Attend "Making Learning and Teaching Visible" campus event every spring. Attend campus lectures and forums from the Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences division. Apply for Summer Financial Aid. Inter Quarter – Optional If summer is not an option, consider taking ART 101 in spring quarter. If summer is not an option, consider taking ART 210 in spring quarter.

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About the Pathway

This pathway is meets requirements for the Associate of Arts Direct-Transfer Agreement (AA-DTA) with an emphasis in Art History. Completion of this pathway provides a visual and historical analysis of objects made throughout time. In lectures, discussions, and online content, students discover the broader context that surround works of art, design, and architecture, providing an understanding of why these objects were made, what they represent, and how they can tell us stories of humanity. Courses in Art History prepare students for transferring into an Art History major and satisfy Art History requirements for students entering into a Studio Art major.

Apply for Financial Aid and Other Funding

You do not need to be a full-time student to receive financial aid funds.

Length of Program

90 credits = 7 quarters (including 10 credits in summer).

With early planning, it is possible to earn your Associate of Fine Arts (AFA) alongside your Associate of Arts (AA) by taking six additional classes (at minimum). Meet with the Arts, Design & Graphics area of study advisor in your first quarter to plan this dual degree pathway.

Class Times/Delivery Format?

Art history classes are taught in hybrid (half online, half in person) or fully online modalities. All studio art courses are taught in person. North offers English, Individuals, Cultures & Societies, Natural World and Computation courses on-campus in the day, evenings, online, or hybrid (part on-campus and part online), and occasional Saturdays.
