Clarify the Path: Program Pathway Maps

- Officially 2.5 years into the program mapping project
- Worked with 40+ groups of faculty and advisors
- Content created for 150+ full and part time maps
- 56 pdf maps on the website
- Launching student facing web-based tool for transfer programs in December!
- Next steps:
 - Launching prof tech programs in the new tool
 - Solidifying updating process for these maps
 - Expanding on ways to help students explore what to study

Program Mapping Tool Demonstration

- Check out the new web-based program maps found here live as of Dec 7th: <u>https://northseattle.edu/programs/college-transfer/program-pathways</u> replacing program pages on the website and phone. Maps can be printed
- New features include:
 - Selecting a full-time or part-time program pathway
 - Multiple hyperlinks (new Student Orientation; Directed Self-Placement; Testing, Financial Aid).
 - Quarter by quarter sequencing
 - Distribution requirements and course descriptions tied to ctclink
 - Quarter To Do List which directs steps students need with hyperlinks such as Starfish, Counseling, Student Learning Center
 - Real time updates

OER (Open Educational Resources) Seed Team

Team members: Zola Mumford, Caroline Pew, Dan Tarker, Aryana Bates

- Goal: Create accessible open source educational materials for students.
 - A primary function of this group is to cultivate more comprehensive and transparent use of open education resources and pedagogy across academic programs at North.
- Requirement: House Bill 1375 (2017) requires colleges to identify courses that use Open Education Resources (OER) or low-cost textbooks in the class schedule.
- Request: Build OE into institution via Guided Pathways funding and support
 - Create open textbooks and/or portfolios of open/freely available resources and open teaching practices
 - Leverage current resources systematically
 - Use OER/Low-cost labels in ctcLink
 - Incorporate Librarians into project work
 - Track SBCTC efforts
 - Support structure for faculty to be funded (100-Day Project)

Statewide Guided Pathways Conference

A group of folx from North attended a statewide Guided Pathways conference.

- Learning Outcomes of the conference
 - Discover equity-centered transformative leadership tenets designed to examine ways to transition from crisis to opportunity.
 - Examine ways to prioritize transformative change within the intake process in alignment with essential practice areas (Intake, Sense of belonging, Structured Exploratory Experiences).
 - Build knowledge of equity-centered data analysis practices to identify and assess alignment of college Guided Pathways priorities with enrollment goals.

A few members of the group shared several takeaways: Leanna Bordner, Aimee Brown, Stephanie Dykes and Jae Suk.

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- We need to think about how are we doing our work not just FOR our students, but also how we are doing this work WITH our students
- We should think about transformative change not transactional change by deconstructing and reconstructing knowledge acquired
- It's important to have policies and practices that demonstrate authentic care for students and each other
- One of the conference speakers said, "You cannot do transformative change if you are wedded to the status quo."
- The need for data and who is in charge of it was mentioned.
- How can we improve retention rate with things like attendance and working together with our students?
