The **Pre-College Math Sequence** is designed to prepare students to:

- enter college math classes
- can be used to earn credit for a high school diploma (HS+)

Summary:

Students who successfully complete a Transitional Studies math class are eligible to enroll in further Transitional Studies math classes or switch to the Pre-College MATH sequence.

All Transitional Studies math classes have face-to-face instruction and built-in tutoring.

Transitional Studies math is a good option for students who are ineligible for financial aid or whose financial aid package will not be available before the start of the quarter.

Students receiving Federal Financial Aid/Pell Grant may concurrently enroll in Transitional Studies math and other college-level courses; however, ABE (\$25) tuition is not covered by Pell Grant and does not apply toward Pell's minimum credit calculations.

Students who successfully complete a Pre-College MATH class are eligible to enroll in further Pre-College MATH classes or switch to the Transitional Studies math sequence.

Pre-College Math has fully online options. Tutoring is also readily available.

Financial Aid (Federal PELL Grant/State Need Grant) will pay for tuition/fees/textbooks. Students receiving the Pell Grant must be enrolled at least half time (6-8 cr).

Pre-college MATH credits may be applied toward Pell Grant's minimum standards for enrollment. Enrollment status effects the total amount of aid a student may receive.
