Important Notes & Requirements
- Completion of at least 90 college-level credits (courses numbered 100 or above), including transferred in credits, with a minimum cumulative college level GPA of 2.0 is required to earn the AA degree.
 - A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in courses at the degree awarding college.
 - Courses may only be used once in Basic, Distribution & Elective requirements.
 - Minimum passing grade of 1.0 is required in all courses.
 - At least 15 credits must be earned at the degree granting campus.
 - Students should apply for degree/graduation one quarter prior to anticipated graduation date.
 - Completion of degree does not guarantee admission to a university/major program nor that all general education requirements are met.
 - Statistics does not satisfy UW CADR (College Academic Distribution Requirements)
