# Guiding Team Meeting Minutes May 11, 2020

- There is a difference between online teaching and emergency remote teaching we have moved to due to COVID-19
  - Online Teaching and Learning: The purposeful design and implementation of an online course. Courses are designed and facilitated according to best practices for online teaching and learning.
  - Remote Instruction: Moving content designed for face-to-face instruction online for limited or one-timeonly course instruction.
  - Emergency Remote Teaching: In contrast to experience planned from the beginning and designed to be online, emergency remote teaching (ERT) is a temporary shift of instructional delivery to an alternate delivery mode due to crisis circumstances.
- The primary objective in these circumstances is not to re-create a robust educational ecosystem but rather to provide temporary access to instruction and instructional supports in a manner that is quick to set up and is reliably available during an emergency or crisis.

## Student speaker on experience – Sarah Fenton, Student Body President

- The title of the video hit very close to home for her, this time has not been easy. It is heartbreaking to have the world change overnight. No part of her life hasn't been affected by this. Her routine has changed, and the momentum has been derailed. Her mental health has been difficult to manage. The difficulties and challenges we face everyday have been amplified by the Covid-19.
- She thinks North is unique because we are close and has the power to have this unite us more. North is powerful as a team/community.

- Remarked how having a child graduating during this time can result in seeing the student experience first-hand at home
- It is hard to guide students with so much uncertainty and impressed by how the students expressed themselves
